CLASS DEFINITION

Under general supervision, performs supervisory work of average difficulty in assigning and scheduling the repairs, maintenance and cleaning of park buildings and the maintenance of wooden bridges; performs related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF IMPORTANT DUTIES

- 1. Schedules skilled craftsmen and custodial workers to building maintenance work for several buildings and bridges; inspects buildings and bridges.
- 2. Inspects buildings and facilities and prepares work orders to maintain facilities in good condition.
- 3. Estimates material and labor costs of maintenance and repair work; lays out work for maintenance crews obtaining necessary equipment, tools, and supplies to complete job; inspects work in progress and upon completion for compliance with work orders, specifications, and good craftsmanship.
- 4. Approves purchase order requests; instructs personnel in maintenance policies and procedures; maintains adequate supply of repair materials and equipment.
- 5. Keeps building repair and maintenance records and supervises building custodial work; coordinates building repair and maintenance with building occupants.
- 6. Handles complaints of building occupants and supervises the preparation of building facilities for special uses; endorses safe work practices.

IMPORTANT WORKER CHARACTERISTICS

- A. Knowledge of (1) the methods, practices, and techniques of maintaining building and facilities in good condition; (2) the equipment, tools, and materials used in the work; (3) techniques of effective supervision.
- B. Skill in (1) the operation of some building maintenance equipment; (2) and performing building inspections; (3)

maintaining building repair records.

C. Ability to (1) supervise and perform skilled building maintenance work; (2) understand oral and written instruction; (3) read and understand blueprints, plans and drawings; (4) estimate time and materials needed in building maintenance work and; (5) to work effectively with others.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. High school graduation or GED, including course work in the building crafts and,
- 2. Several years experience in performing skilled building maintenance work or,
- 3. An equivalent combination of training and experience.

WORKING CONDITIONS

Works inside and outside of buildings; some exposure to inclement weather, dirt, dust and odors. May be required to bend, crawl and crouch.
