		These oral histories provide a detailed and personal view from a few of the people who have been a part of world events, including a radio intercept operator prior to World War I and Navajo Code Talkers.
		A few select, unclassified monographs are also available to the public from the Museum Library. They cover a wide range of cryptographic subjects from early American ciphers to the Vietnam War. Most of the monographs were written and published by NSA's Center for Cryptologic History. These monographs go into greater depth than the museum exhibits or museum pamphlets and help to provide a greater understanding of the events in which cryptology played a role in world history. The Library is open to the public, however the hours vary. Please call ahead to ensure that a staff member will be present to assist you.
